Job description

What is the role?

Affinity Trust is undergoing significant procurement change. An Exec-sponsored procurement project has been underway for the last few months to identify an operating model from which the maturity and effectiveness of procurement within the organisation can sustainably grow further.

To support this objective, Affinity Trust wishes to appoint an experienced procurement professional to engender change and work collaboratively to drive the business forward, both internally and externally, to increase control, procurement influence and deliver tangible value.

Working with the business as a Procurement Centre of Excellence, you will need to combine a strategic procurement methodology with 'hands on' implementation, identify opportunities in collaboration with stakeholders and take accountability for delivering them. The remit will cover the full end-to-end supply chain from requirements through to supplier relationship management and purchase-to-pay processes. Savings delivery will be a key aspect of the role, balanced with delivering the needs of the people we support, internal stakeholders and overall business objectives.

Business areas have historically conducted their own procurement, so effective stakeholder management will be critical in this role. It will be extremely important to quickly gain credibility and build strong relationships with senior internal stakeholders, in an environment where procurement is not always mandated. Procurement within Affinity Trust is not subject to public procurement regulations.

You will need to build on and embed the procurement approach that has been developed to date, as well as introducing further best practice and support and help the business in applying it. This is a role that will require an adept and confident communicator to win 'the hearts and minds' of all business areas, across all levels.

Over time it is expected that you will develop a procurement strategy to support the longerterm aspirations of the business.



What will you deliver?

- 1. **Strategic Leadership:** Lead the development and delivery of the organisation's procurement strategy in line with our mission and growth ambitions. Develop and implement best practice procurement, contract management and supplier management processes and tools and create an environment where these are consistently adopted across business areas.
- 2. **Operational Effectiveness:** Develop and implement sourcing strategies for key spend areas, working collaboratively with business stakeholders to deliver a combination of quick wins and longer-term strategic initiatives. Lead tenders, conduct negotiations and manage contracts and SPRM (Supplier Performance and Relationship Management).
- 3. **Risk and Regulatory Compliance:** Ensure our supply chain is appropriately risk-managed and fit for purpose to support the needs of the people we support and our stakeholders.
- 4. **Business Value:** Identify and deliver tangible value improvement opportunities (financial, performance and risk) within Affinity Trust's end-to-end supply chain.
- 5. **Partnership Working:** Build and maintain effective relationships with strategic and critical supply partners to foster collaboration, innovation and optimise value.
- 6. **Leadership & Business Partnering:** Lead cross-functional teams on sourcing projects promoting a culture of value for money, collaboration and accountability. Develop Affinity Trust's understanding of procurement and capability through effective communication, coaching and mentoring.
- 7. **Corporate Leadership:** Build strong and effective relationships with members of the senior leadership teams, collaborate and contribute to corporate goals and objectives.
- 8. **Financial Management:** Provide input and support to the business planning process by providing information and insights into forecast 3rd party expenditure, cost avoidance and savings opportunities.
- 9. **Purchase to Pay:** Support the business in developing and implementing purchase to pay efficiencies and best practice.
